Peer Assistance Leadership (PAL) is a program designed to increase the engagement of underperforming students and youth. **Nevada Community Prevention Coalition Inc. (NvCPC)** will be implementing this community-based program in 23 rural communities within Clark County. The program works by identifying *unengaged youth* and providing them *leadership training* and *adult mentorship* from successful adults in their community. A certified PAL trainer will provide a one-day training to both youth and adults and NvCPC will provide continued program support once both parties have received training.

The steps to implement this program are listed below:

1. Identify 2 unengaged youth from each of the 23 rural Clark County communities
2. Identify 2 responsible adults from each of the 23 rural Clark County communities
3. Certified PAL trainers will provide one-day trainings to both groups; each training will be offered at two locations, one in northern Clark County and one in Southern Clark County
4. Youth will be paired with responsible adult mentors from their communities
5. Youth and adults will work together to identify other unengaged youth from the area and find ways to engage them, including planning community events and developing youth advisory boards
6. Nevada Community Prevention Coalition Inc. will continue to provide program support, including helping to facilitate community meetings, identifying resources for community events, and attending events
